Frequently Asked Questions

<p>Q: Organisations from which countries are eligible for funding? <i>(ID 1)</i></p>	<p>A: The focus of twinning is on local, regional and national health and care providers in Europe that wish to adopt innovative solutions which are available for transfer from another local, regional and national health and care provider in Europe.</p> <p>As the twinning scheme is implemented within a Horizon2020 project, H2020 eligible countries can apply.</p>
<p>Q: Does the adopter have to be a local authority or can be in general a local health care provider (for instance an enterprise)? <i>(ID 2)</i></p> <p>Can universities or other learning institutions apply? <i>(ID 3)</i></p>	<p>A: Twinning activities must involve the transfer of digital know-how to at least one Twinning Adopter region from another region or organisation (Twinning Originator). Twinning Originator and Twinning Adopter(s) must be from different countries.</p>
<p>Q: Are you going to postpone the deadline due to the current Coronavirus crisis that impacts all European regions? <i>(ID 4)</i></p>	<p>A: At this point in time no extension of the deadline is planned. However, DigitalHealthEurope is monitoring closely the situation. An extension of the call regarding some twinning types is being considered.</p>
<p>Q: Is any type of the twinings (knowledge exchange, partial or full adoption) possible to be done between 2 regions as Adopters and one company as Originator? <i>(ID 5)</i></p>	<p>A: Twinning can be between one Twinning Originator one Twinning Adopter, or between one Twinning Originator and multiple Adopters. Note that the maximum allowed for Twinning Subcontracting is not additional: it should be included in the maximum cost of one twinning.</p>
